Can My Schedule Change After the Deadline?

YES

1. Academic Misplacement: Student placed in wrong level course or in a course without meeting prerequisite.
2. Program Change: Student accepted into or no longer enrolled in specific program such as Eastland/Fairfield, Pathways and Mosaic
3. Missing an Academic Course: Student missing core course such as English, history, math or science.
4. Missing a Graduation Requirement: Student missing a course necessary to graduate in the upcoming school year.
5. Study Center : A student has two study centers in one semester and none in the other.
6. Overcrowding : To balance courses so overcrowding does not occur.

1. To have courses with friends.
2. To have a course or study center a certain period.
3. Changing the schedule results in one or more courses being overloaded.
4. Student or parent prefers a certain teacher
5. Student or parent does not want the assigned teacher.
6. The teacher is "too hard" or "not hard enough."
7. Teacher does not teach in a preferred "style."
